## **PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP IN TECHNICAL AND VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING**

### **1. Background**

The whole world is changing rapidly. Everyone expects positive transformation. That's why everyone should work diligently keeping in mind the prospects of the future. Public and private. All the institutions need to come forward to support development of professional skills.

To remain competitive in the global market we need to create skilled manpower through technical and vocational education and training. Our education system has to be more attuned to job-market needs.
