

ollege Council elected amongst others, its members to serve in a Finance Committee (FINCO) constituted in terms of the approved statutory charter. FINCO members are fifty percent external persons who are in Council and College Principal and Deputy Principal Finance. The term of office for this committee coincide with the Council term for external members. The committee holds its financial meetings which are in line with the prescribed period in the charter. It is of great importance to also highlight the below listed strategic assignments and functions carried by this committee:
Monitor the implementation of the delegation of authority framework prescribed by the Department of Higher Education and Training.

■ Take overall responsibility for the review of the appropriateness and applicability of the financial policies and make recommendations to Executive Committee prior ratification by Council.

■ Oversee and approve College budget submissions, deviations

and quarterly revisions and ensure that outputs to be delivered are specific and consistent.

Make recommendations to EXCO prior ratification by Council that the necessary steps are taken to instigate any financial related investigations into financial misconduct or maladministration when policy processes have not been followed in the college.

• Ensure that appropriate management information system is established to provide prompt and accurate financial data and information.

• Consider quarterly and monthly financial reports and ensure acceptable standard and adequately reflect any shortfall or under-collections in budgeted income as well as any overspending as it may result in unauthorised expenditure.

*FINCO considered, reviewed and recommended to EXCO prior ratification by Council the following responsibilities*Revenue and expenditure in the quarterly reports of the

college and proposed remedial action where necessary.

Annual Financial Statements.

All financial matters relating to College's relationship with the Department of Higher Education and Training, NSFAS, other organisations of government and corporate business.

Any capital projects, prior to commitment and to monitor and report progress.

Any necessary and appropriate increases in estimated total costs of projects included in the approved budget, over and above the pre-approved variation in the Supply Chain Management Policy, that management are proposing.

Any sale or disposal of moveable assets.

■ Managements of business case for disposal of immovable assets.

The committee maintained its emphasis to monitor and assess the introduction and implementation of internal control measures and financial management system. The outputs have been attained to ensure clear financial governance and resulted in a clean audit outcome issued to the College by the Auditor General since the 2016. Another strategic area of focus by the committee is on the supply chain management of the college. A committee recommendation has been ratified by Council that an intense investigation be conducted for an integrated budget management to be implemented in the college which will also control the procurement processes and expenditure.

On behalf of the members, we commit to continue carrying the responsibilities and functions of the committee to maintain a clean financial audit in the interest of ensuring provision of higher education and training services to the students in a sustainable and accountable manner.

We ascertain that public funds remain in good hands and doors are wide open for corporate industry that has invested confidence in the College.

The stakeholder engagement session held by Nkangala TVET College on the 9th November 2018 in Witbank was graced by the presence of the Deputy Minister of Higher Education and Training, Mr Buti Manamela. The session aimed to present the College's financial and academic position to the targeted stakeholders, attracting them to invest in the college and placement of TVET graduates.

During the opening of the session, Principal of the College, Mr Cain Maimela said to the stakeholders in attendance. "We have a common vested interest in youth development, so forming sustainable partnership will create a win-win solution for all parties involved".

During the keynote message, The Deputy Minister urged companies to open doors for TVET graduates to give them the necessary exposure to work industry and experience. The Deputy Minister further said that TVET Colleges can only be the best when the industry opens doors. "Business entities should invest in the placement of TVET students for learnerships, apprenticeships,

internships and permanent job opportunities. Their partnership with TVET Colleges will assist the department

to achieve the goal of the National Development Plan (NDP), which is to contribute to the skilled and capable workforce to support inclusive growth". The Deputy Minister added that TVET Colleges must be academic institutions of choice for the skills needed in South Africa.

After delivering his keynote address, the Deputy Minister then proceeded to eMalahleni Civic Centre where Youth Career Expo hosted by Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET) took place. The Deputy Minister engaged with the youth on the opportunities the department continues to make available for them. The outreach targeted out-of-school youth in townships and rural areas and gave young people a platform to engage with the department and learn about opportunities funded by the National

Skills Fund (NSF) through Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) colleges, state-owned companies and skills development. The career and skills expo exhibitions was attended by Nkangala TVET College, National Student Financial Assistance Scheme (NSFAS), Gert Sibande TVET College, University of Limpopo, Sefako Makgatho University, as well as various sector education and training authorities, amongst others.



APPOINTMENT OF THE NEW CFO

New appointed Chief Financial Officer (CFO), Ms Simphiwe Matsabe was born in a small town called Sabie in Mpumalanga. She attended both her primary and secondary education. She then enrolled at Wits University for a degree and honours in the faculty of

Economic and Management sciences (accounting). Afterwards, she entered the corporate world within her field of study. "My first employment was with Klynveld Peat Marwick Goerdeler (KPMG) doing articles for the mining sector. After some time, I became an Auditor in charge for some of the biggest mining companies like Sasol oil, BHP Billiton and Samancor Chrome", she said.

After 3 years in Auditing sector and passing her board exam, she subsequently qualified as a Chartered Accountant, CA (SA). At some point in her career life she ventured in the advisory space where she has been practising for the past 5 years. "Some of the projects I worked on include; Passenger Rail Agency of South Africa (PRASA) new trains asset capitalisation framework, National Treasury's roadmap from cash to accrual and the Department of Mineral Resources debt recoveries project which led them to an unqualified audit opinion".

Ms Matsabe says she will contribute her whole-hearted effort to ensure that the institution performs well. "My stay in this institution must provide timely, accurate and complete information and analysis to support transparent decision-making, as this is clearly prescribed in the College mission. We have a responsibility to instill investors' confidence", she said.

Workshills competition is a movement aiming at raising the profile and recognition of skilled people, showing how important skills are in achieving economic growth and personal success and encouraging parity of esteem between vocational and academic qualifications. It organises the world championships of vocational skills and is held every two years in different parts of the world. The organisation which also hosts conferences about vocational skills describes itself as the global hub for skills identification amongst talented youth.

WorldSkills competition brings together young people, industry, government and educational institutions to promote the benefits of and the need for skilled trade professionals. At the most recent event, WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017, there were competitions in 51 skills areas with close to 1 300 young people across the globe partaking. WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2017 took place between 15 and 18 October 2017 in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates. The next WorldSkills competition will be held in Kazan, Russia in 2019.

Nkangala TVET College, as a centre of excellence for artisan training has also qualified for national competitions in different skill programs including Information Technology, whereby two students from Middelburg Campus namely; Ronald Green-Thompson and Kabelo Matji under the mentorship of Mr Lebeshe (WorldSkills provincial IT expert) will represent the Mpumalanga province in Information Technology. The event will take place from 20 - 26 February 2019 in Durban, South Africa. This is towards the selection for international competitions that will take place in Kazan, Russia in October 2019. The College is participating for the second time in this global competition.

Other trades that will be competing in Durban for qualifying to compete in the world competition include; welding represented by Tefo Ratau (Middelburg campus) and Remember Batela (Witbank campus) under the supervision of Modishi Thapelo, automobile technology represented by Tiego Mabooa (Mpondozankomo campus) under the mentorship of Makhubedu Sophy and hairdressing represented by Thabisile Mahlangu (CN Mahlangu campus).

INTERGRATED QUALITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (IQMS)?

The IQMS is an integrated quality management system that consists of two programmes, which are aimed at enhancing and monitoring performance of the education system. These are:

Developmental Appraisal; and
Performance Measurement.

The purpose of Developmental Appraisal (DA) is to appraise individual educators in a transparent manner with a view to determining areas of strength and weakness, and to draw up programmes for individual development.

The purpose of Performance Measurement (PM) is to evaluate individual teachers for salary progression, grade progression, and affirmation of appointments, rewards and incentives.

These programmes are implemented in an integrated way in order to ensure optimal effectiveness and co-ordination of the various programmes.



Why IQMS?

- To determine competence;
- To assess strengths and areas for development;
- To identify specific needs of educators, colleges and the TVET Directorate for support and development;
- To provide support for continued learning and growth;
- To promote accountability;
- To monitor an institution's overall
- effectiveness; and
- To evaluate an educator's performance.

Performance standards are developed according to posts, and then performance standards are assessed during baseline evaluation, which takes place from January to March every year. During the baseline process, it is when one identifies their areas of weakness so as to be improved when going to summative evaluation in September to November in order to qualify for 1% pay progression. Proper management of the IQMS has a potential to develop and yield positive results to all parties concerned.
